I'd like to personally inform you of the changes that have taken place at Alliance....

First of all, I want to welcome two new physicians joining our group and starting this summer. Cristina Horton MD finished her OB/GYN training at Sparrow Hospital this past June. Cristina has already started seeing patients at Alliance. Sara Cramton MD completed her OB/GYN residency at William Beaumont Hospital in Royal Oak, Michigan. Sara is currently scheduling patients and started seeing patients August 3rd. Cristina and Sara will both be practicing the full range of obstetrics and gynecology.
